### JEREMY GROSSER M.D.

Dr. Jeremy Grosser is Board Certified in Internal Medicine and Hospice and Palliative Care, and has been a member of the medical staff at Northridge Hospital Medical Center since April 1, 2003. An expert in hospital based Internal Medicine, Dr. Grosser received his medical degree from Temple University in Philadelphia PA. He completed his Internal Medicine residency at Olive View/ UCLA Medical Center here in the San Fernando Valley, where he was honored as Intern of the Year and selected as Chief Resident. In 2010 he became Medical Director for Palliative Care at Northridge Hospital Medical Center, helping patients and families navigate severe chronic and life-limiting illnesses. In 2014, he helped develop and led the hospital’s innovative Transitional Care and Chronic Disease Management program, which focuses on post-acute care coordination and hospital readmission prevention. Throughout his career Dr. Grosser has held numerous leadership positions, including Chair of the Department of Medicine, member of the Medical Executive Committee for more than 15 years, and Chief of Staff from 2022- 2024, while serving on multiple quality improvement committees that helped Northridge Hospital achieve CMS Five- Star and Leapfrog “A” recognition. Dr. Grosser has been a member of the Northridge Hospital Foundation Board for over 10 years, and he is currently the Foundation President. He has also received multiple Teaching Excellence Awards from the Northridge Hospital Family Practice Residency Program and was recently named a Top Doctor in Los Angeles for Hospice and Palliative Medicine.
